Dear Parishioners,

In just a few weeks our nation will again hold elections. Voting is one of our greatest duties as Christian citizens. The Catholic bishops of the United States are pleased to offer once again to the Catholic faithful a document called, ***Forming Consciences for Faithful Citizenship***, which is a teaching document on the political responsibility of Catholics. This document represents a snapshot of guidance for Catholics in the exercise of their rights and duties as participants in our democracy. As your pastor, I encourage you to read this document in preparation for the upcoming election.

As a Catholic voter it is important to weigh a candidate's position on each of these essential God-given rights that government has a duty to protect, beginning with the right to life. All persons of every race and nation are created in the image and likeness of God and therefore possess both dignity and a right to life from the first moment of conception. As Pope Francis personally expressed that the right to life for the unborn child is the preeminent issue because it is fundamental; without this first right, the right to life, there can be no other rights.

At the heart of the matter, our vote must also help us to love our neighbor by enacting policies that protect the voiceless, the weak, strengthen families, promote conditions that allow all of creation to flourish. Our vote needs to ensure that everyone can practice their faith and follow their conscience without fear of retaliation. In our country, civil society and religious institutions are an essential foundation of our nations freedom.

As we are a few weeks away, we pray for our leaders, those seeking to be leaders and those already elected. May they have the experience of being a beloved child of God and allow that love to transform their words and actions towards love and respect for all people.

We pray for our United States of America. May we seek understanding first and listen attentively to those who disagree with us, seeking to be examples of love and peace.

We pray for our Church. May the love of Christ inspire us, guide and direct our actions by living out Jesus' example to love each person.

I encourage you to study prayerfully the political platforms of the parties. While it is not my role to endorse a specific candidate, or political party, it is my responsibility as your pastor, to carry out the teaching and mission of the church that God is love and is the author of every human life from the moment of conception to natural death.

Our Lady Seat of Wisdom...Pray for us! Give us the grace and wisdom that we need to make the best informed decision we can make, based upon truth and not our feelings our emotions as we vote in the upcoming elections.
